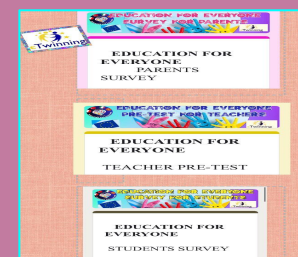

Brain storming: Create a wordcloud about Inclusion.



Class discussion: reading stories, articles or watching videos on inclusion and discrimination.



Game: "The Circle of Friendship": The Leader passes the object to another person across the circle, but before passing it, he or she must say something positive or kind about that person.





March



Photography project : students take photos or videos of positive examples of inclusion at school: Sharing of results : each school uploads their photos/videos to TwinSpace with a brief description.



Creation of the Manifesto for Inclusion with digital tools.



Guided tours. Involve students in community volunteer activities, such as visits to nursing homes or centers for the disabled, to interact with people from different backgrounds





April

Celebrates cultural or social diversity through art



performance: song, a theatrical performance, a piece of music.



Create a awareness campaign on inclusion and diversity, with flyer or slogan, spreading it around school and using social media, to raise local awareness.



Short video which chronicles the project experience, including interviews with students and highlights of the activities.
